

## Springbank Airport (YBW) Nighttime Jet Departure Study Fact Sheet

### Background:

Although there is no formal or regulated restriction for jet activity at YBW, jet operators have adhered to a request to restrict jet activity during nighttime hours at YBW. Recently, The Calgary Airport Authority (The organization responsible for the management and development of Springbank Airport) received a formal request from Springbank Airport Business and Pilots Association (SABPA) to formally permit jet operations during night time hours (23:00 – 07:00).

### Jet operations at YBW Facts:

- Jet activity currently represents less than 2% of YBW's total movements
- Jet operators anticipate an additional 14 flights per month
- Baseline data of existing operations over the past five years is being analyzed

### The Study Process:

#### 1. Step 1:

Baseline data of existing operations over the past five years is being analyzed. The baseline study will be used to benchmark jet activity at YBW going forward, and includes:

Basic Assessment of the current activity at YBW

- Fleet Mix and Base Case Review
- Single Event Contours – including jet forecast
- N60/N70 Contours – including jet forecast
- Introduction of virtual noise monitoring to assess noise impacts at various locations around the airport.

#### 2. Step 2 (12 months post operation implementation):

Impact Assessment following the new operations in place, which will include:

- Fleet Mix and Actual Case Assessment
- Single Event Contours – Jet VS Prop
- N60/70 Contours – Jet VS Prop

### Next Steps:

Effective July 13, 2015, nighttime departures by jet aircraft will be permitted at Springbank Airport (YBW).
